Whole School Writing focus

Our writing focus for the beginning of Term 2 is **recount.** A recount is a style of writing that recalls an event or experience. They're usually based on the experience of the writer and are therefore most often told from the first-person perspective.

A recount is also told in the past tense because the event or experience has already happened.

Recounts are usually told in chronological order, that is, the events are described in the order they happened. This helps the reader or listener to understand what's going on. To make this clearer, you can use adverbs like 'firstly', 'next', 'then' and 'finally' to signal the order of events to the reader.

<u>Spelling Program – Soundwaves</u>

Over the last couple of weeks, we have covered the following sounds (phonemes): 'h' as in house, 'j' as in jellyfish and 'ai' as in snail.

In writing, we are working on recounts and will continue to do so for a little longer. The older students will be writing recounts of historical events as part of our history unit of work.

In Maths, we have been working on multiplication and will move into division shortly. We have been looking at patterns in the times tables – multiplying by 0 and 1 and the 9 times tables adding to 9 when we add the digits of the answer, for example. We have been working hard to solve 2-part problems in Maths, working on some together, so we can work with what we know to solve the other parts of the problem. Meridith has been working on time.

In our integrated unit of work, History, we have been looking at past and present and making comparisons of how life was then and how life is now. We have compiled a list of some vocabulary that might be used such as timeline, era, epoch, period, then, now, past, present, for example.

We are looking forward to our Gymnastics coming up, which is part of our Sporting Schools funding.
